### COAST GUARD ACCEPTS 2014 ART COLLECTION

Works to go to Federal Hall following Salmagundi Club show

Twenty-three works by 20 artists were accepted by the Coast Guard into its permanent collection during an opening reception June 26<sup>th</sup> at the Salmagundi Club in New York City. The 2014 collection was on view at the club for two weeks, starting June 21. It will go on

display at Federal Hall National Memorial on July 31 and will remain on view there until the end of September. The memorial is located just across from the New York Stock Exchange and draws a very large audience.

### Robert Selby Wins 2014 George Gray Award

Vermont-based artist Robert Selby is the recipient of the 2014 George Gray Award for Artistic Excellence for his painting "Chukchi Reach," which depicts scientists gathering ice samples for their research on the ecosystem of the Chukchi Sea in the Arctic Ocean. With a grant from Champlain College in Burlington, Vt., where he teaches, he was able to deploy aboard the Cutter Healy for two weeks last summer. In addition to this painting, the artist also created an artist's sketchbook, comprised

of 30 drawings which provide portraits of the cutter's crew's and scientists' daily life aboard the ship. Bob Selby enjoyed a 20-year career as a staff illustrator at The Providence Journal. During that time, he was the recipient of numerous awards including a Fulbright Grant to research the history of caricature in Spain. Following this, he embarked on a career as a freelance illustrator, painter and sculptor. He has taught at the University of Massachusetts in Dartmouth and the Rhode Island School of Design in Providence. Vt. His art career has garnered awards and recognition from The Associated Press, the Society of Illustrators in New York and the Society of Newspaper Design.
